Dear Colleague

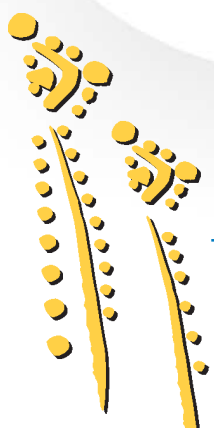
